Deployed **183** mini-water treatment systems around the world to **15 countries**, providing up to **1.83 million** gallons of safe water a day.

Conducted **36 virtual classroom sessions**, using the Internet to extend our impact and empower more international partners to transform their local communities.

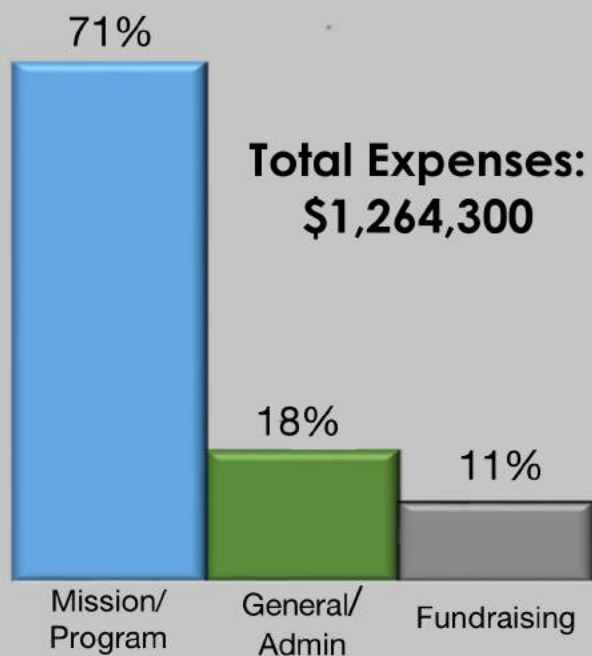


Sent **160 people** into the field to educate and train communities who are committed to seeing their lives changed by safe water.

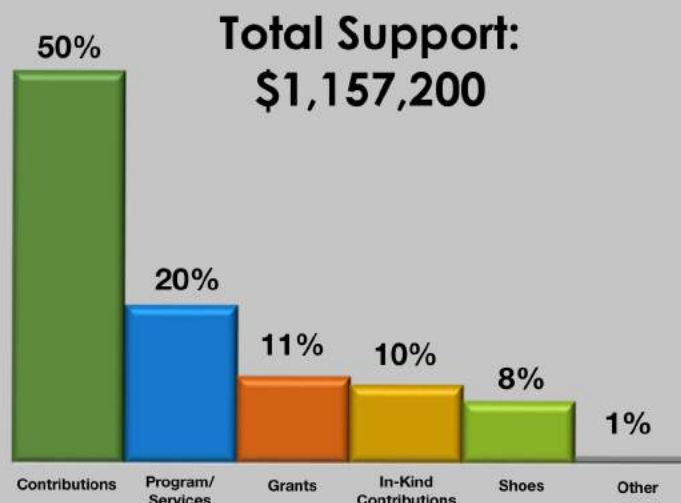
**Trained 40+ individuals** to provide disaster relief to victims of the earthquake in Nepal, meeting an immediate need with a sustainable resource.
